Bus Pass College/Vocational TAP Card

College/Vocational Monthly Pass- \$43

To **qualify for a bus pass** discount, you **must complete the College/Vocational TAP application**. It's available in the main office, online and at Metro Customer Centers. Submit the completed application at any Metro Customer Center or mail it to the TAP Reduced Fare Office, One Gateway Plaza, Mail Stop: 99-PL-4, Los Angeles, CA 90012-2952. After you receive your college/Vocational TAP card, you can buy the reduced-rate pass every month at any Metro Customer Center or area pass vendors.

All students qualified (including ESL students) if you provide proof of enrollment in a minimum of 12 hours of in-classroom study per week for a minimum of 3 consecutive months.
