THIS WEEK IN HISTORY:

February 1, 1884, the first portion, or fascicle, of the Oxford English Dictionary (OED), considered the most comprehensive and accurate dictionary of the English language, is published. Today, the Oxford English Dictionary is the definitive authority on the meaning, pronunciation and history of over half a million words, past and present. Unlike most English dictionaries, which only list present-day common meanings, the OED provides a detailed chronological history for every word and phrase, citing quotations from a wide range of sources, including classic literature and cookbooks.

STUDENT HEALTH REMINDERS:

Working among so many individuals in a school environment, it is nearly impossible not to become exposed to some sort of virus. But there are some things you can do to stay healthy..

- Wash your hands with soap and warm water frequently for 30 seconds. Use an alcohol-based sanitizer, use directed amount of sanitizer, and rub thoroughly over all surfaces of the hands.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze and clean your hands afterwards.
- Keep your hands away from your eyes, nose and mouth to keep flu germs from entering your body
