## District Policy You Should Know:

### Bullying and Hazing Policy—Bul-5212.0

LAUSD will not tolerate bullying or any behavior infringing on the safety or well-being of any persons within the District's jurisdiction. It will not tolerate retaliation for reporting it. Bullying is aggressive behavior involving the imbalance of real/perceived physical/psychological power. Staff is to discuss this policy with students and encourage them to report bullying. They should know the signs of bullying and intervene immediately. The bulletin then gives the steps for responding to bullying complaints.
