This Week in History: **END OF CIVIL WAR**

June 2, 1865: Confederate General Edmund Kirby Smith, commander of Confederate forces signs the surrender terms offered by Union negotiators. With Smith's surrender, the last Confederate army ceased to exist, bringing a formal end to the bloodiest four years in U.S. history. The American Civil War began on April 12, 1861, when Confederate shore batteries fired on Union-held Fort Sumter in South Carolina. Two days later, U.S. President Abraham Lincoln issued a proclamation calling for 75,000 volunteer soldiers to help quell the Southern "insurrection." Four long years later, the Confederacy was defeated at the total cost of 620,000 Union and Confederate dead.

District Policy You Should Know:

Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting

Pursuant to State law and District policy, all District employees are mandated reporters of suspected child abuse/neglect. Reporting must be immediate and is two part: 1) a telephone report must be made immediately or as soon as practically possible; 2) a written report must be completed and mailed to a child protective services agency within 36 hours. By law, the LAUSD Police Department is not a child protective services agency and is not authorized to take reports or to investigate allegations of child abuse/neglect.

**Remember to complete your Child Abuse Awareness Training each school year :
Employees will have access on July 1, 2016 via the learning zone for 2016-17 .**
