“Know Your Rights” Webinar: (Final Notice)

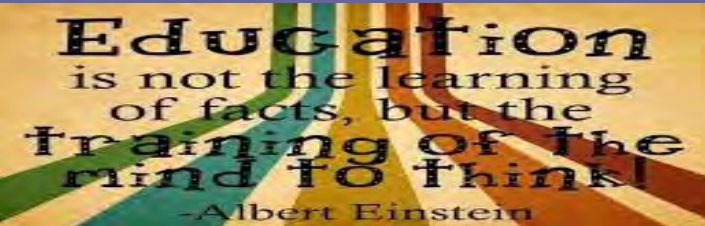

DISTRICT POLICY BULLETINS

BUL1704—Time Off for Voting When Employees Do Not Have Sufficient Time Outside of Working Hours:

Employees are eligible for paid time off for the purpose of voting, in local and statewide elections, only if they do not have sufficient time outside of working hours to vote. Voting hours are from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm. Employees may be provided the necessary time needed in order to vote, but limited to a maximum of two hours paid time.

Employees must give the District at least two working days advanced notice of their need to take this time off for voting. The time provided to the employee be taken at the beginning or end of the employee’s work day.
