HiSET® @Home

Students are able to take advantage of testing at home during the school closures. The HiSET at Home cost is as follows:



- First Test = \$50.25 includes \$20.00 state fee
- All other Test = \$30.25
- Total cost of Full Battery Test = \$171.25 •
- Retest = \$17.50
- Students can pay for one test at a time and take one test at a time.

Students will need to meet the equipment and environment requirements prior to registering for the HiSET® exam at home option. Please contact a counselor today for the full list of requirements.
