“When I came here, I could not imagine what my life in America would be like, but I knew that I wanted to get an education.”

Nhi Mui Tong is from Ho Chi Min City, Vietnam. She immigrated to the United States two years ago with the aspiration to get an education. “When I came here, I could not imagine what my life in America would be like, but I knew that I wanted to get an education.” Encouraged by her mother-in-law, who had studied at ELAOC Skills Center Campus five years earlier, Nhi started in ESL level 2B with Mr. Lemus and Ms. Tarasyuk in 2018. She studied English all the time and set her goal to complete each level of ESL.

By 2019, she was promoted to the Intermediate High-A (4) level and co-enrolled in the VESL Health Career class. Despite the current 2020 pandemic, Nhi continued her education learning to Zoom and use Schoology. She credits her classmates, Ms. Leon and Ms. Giglio, for their support and encouragement to continue to study online. This year, she completed the IET Health Information Technology and Medical Terminology classes. Most recently, in November, she reached her goal by finishing the ESL program. Nhi is very excited about her future and is now enrolled in the CNA program. Nhi’s ambition is to have a career in the medical field as a Medical Assistant. She added, “I am fortunate and grateful for the

opportunity at ELASC and encourage everyone to set a goal for yourself, like I did, and don’t let anything stop you.”

Lan Ngoc Phan is from Ben Tre City, Vietnam. She came to the U.S. in 2008 with the dream of having an education and an opportunity to get ahead. Lan knew that learning English was the key. In 2017, on the recommendation from a friend, she enrolled in ESL classes at ELASC. Lan studied hard, even though learning English was challenging. There were times when she felt like quitting, most notably when the school closed in March due to the pandemic.



The idea of using technology and taking classes online scared her, but with the support of family, friends, and teachers, Lan endured on. She added, “Today, I am proud to say that I know how to use Zoom. I have learned how to type, use tools like Schoology, KAMI, and Google Docs. I have used technology to read, write, and communicate with people in English.” Together with taking ESL, Lan enrolled in the VESL Health Career course. She loves to help people and dreams of a career in the medical field. In November 2020, Lan will complete the ESL program and continue with the VESL course. Her next pathway is to take HiSET classes and the HIT Medical Terminology class. Lan’s confidence in her abilities is an example for her young daughter. She added, “I want my daughter to know that she can achieve anything she sets her mind to.”

Olivia started the academic program and earned her high school diploma in October 2020. **"I took a little longer with obstacles arising."**

She prepared to take the HiSET English and on her first attempt, she passed Math, Social Studies, and Science. She was unable to pass the Reading and Writing portion. Her goal of completing in 2018 was delayed. Olivia had an anxiety attack and didn't take the test, nervousness got the best of her. She got help to overcome and control her anxiety of passing the HiSET test. She always believed in herself, her biggest obstacle was anxiety.

Olivia had other barriers to overcome. She is a mother of three children, she also worked part-time while taking her children to school and took **classes in the evening.** **"While it took longer, I knew I could complete my HS eventually. We all have different obstacles, but I know I would overcome those obstacles and complete my HS."**

Olivia's advice for people thinking of giving up: **"Whatever your obstacles are, don't let any negativity get to you. It doesn't matter how long it takes you to reach your goal, you will reach your goal with dedication."** Olivia would like to take Child Development classes at ELAOC, and start her own childcare business.
