

Employee Attendance Policy

While the large majority of employees have a strong commitment to their work and excellent attendance, it is also clear that unnecessary absenteeism has a negative impact upon student achievement due to interruption of the continuity of instruction, and results in reduced productivity, loss of service, and significant costs to the district. The LAUSD Board of Education expects:

- Employees to maintain regular attendance and avoid absenteeism;
- Employees to work every hour that they are assigned;
- Employees to be at their work stations on time every working day;
- Supervisors to explain and insist upon regular attendance, monitor, and enforce all attendance policies and standards through performance evaluations and discipline processes.

LAUSD will make every attempt to avid scheduling activities that contribute to staff absenteeism.

Quiet Signal

Putting students into groups and teams will no doubt increase the noise level. For this reason, an effective quiet signal is used to stop student interaction for whole class discussion or instructions. When the teacher's hand goes up, students also raise their hands and signal others to raise hands, too. Explain the signal and emphasize full, alert attention in under five seconds. If it takes more time, practice the quiet signal using:

Quiet Signal Steps:

- 1- Hands up, Stop Talking, Stop Doing.
- 2- Full Attention on the Teacher/Presenter
- 3- Signal Others.
