### **Cooperative Learning Strategies:**

### Suggestions for Effective Questioning for Think-Pair-Share (From Learning Together, December 2013)

Below is a list of different types of questions. The questions are listed in order of their recommended usage. The types of questions at or near the top should be used with more frequency than those at or near the bottom.

- 1. Ask students to seek out the evidence:
  - What kind of evidence did you find?
  - What makes you think that ...?
- 2. Ask students to explain:
  - How would you explain this?
  - What were some of the causes that led to ...?
- 3. Ask questions that relate concepts, ideas, and opinions:
  - How does that compare to ...?
  - What did other people discover or say about...?
- 4. Ask questions that encourage your students to predict:
  - What will you do next?
  - What will happen if you...?
  - What could you do to prevent that?
- 5. Ask students questions that encourage them to describe:
  - What do you see?
  - What did you do?
  - What happened?
  - What did you observe happening?
